Mosaic	A design which consists of small pieces of coloured glass, pottery or stone set in concrete or plaster.
Collage	A picture that has been made by sticking pieces of coloured paper, cloth and other materials onto paper.
Column	Central element of a grand building used to support
Tone	How light or dark something is
Ceramic	Tyles used to create mosaic
Proportion	The size of parts, that makes up the whole object
