Key Vocabulary	
Word	Definition
William Turner	A landscape painter of light
perspective	Using lines to make an image appear 3 dimensional (foreground, middle ground, back ground)
Focal point	The area in a painting to which the eye is naturally drawn
Wash	Watery paint (backgrounds, skies, bottom layers). Large paint brush, mix two washes to blend before beginning to paint.
Wet on wet	Wet the paper with just water and a clean brush, add paint with brush, 2-3 colours of 1 colour from the ti.
Wet on dry	Straight onto the paper or base layer which has dried.
Dark to light	Adding more water to a thick paint.
